The UCT Legacy Society and Summer School 2017 are delighted to invite you to a free lecture by Professor Penelope Andrews. The University of Cape Town appointed Professor Penelope (Penny) Andrews as the new Dean of the Faculty of Law. She took up her post in January 2016.

Penny earned her BA in 1980 (majoring in Economic History and Comparative African Government and Administration) and her LLB in 1982 from the then University of Natal in Durban. In 1984 she received an LLM from Columbia University School of Law in New York.

She began her teaching career more than two decades ago at La Trobe University in Melbourne, Australia. She has been tenured at four law schools and has served on significant law school committees and the boards of public interest legal organisations as well as on business councils. Professor Andrews has published four books and more than 50 articles and book chapters focusing on international human rights law, comparative constitutional law, gender and racial equality, and the judiciary. Her most recent book, *From Cape Town to Kabul: Rethinking Strategies for Pursuing Women's Human Rights*, was published by Ashgate in 2012.

Penny's talk at the Summer School guest lecture will be on the extremely relevant topic of decolonisation and transformation. This is a subject that has been hotly debated over the past year not only at UCT but at all universities across South Africa.
