



## 2022 TB Davie Memorial Lecture Call for Nominations

The UCT Academic Freedom Committee (AFC) invites staff and students of the Faculty of Health Sciences to submit nominations for the 2022 TB Davie Memorial Lecture.

The TB Davie Memorial Lecture is an important event in UCT's calendar, and offers an opportunity to affirm and clarify the values of academic freedom in our contemporary context, and to stimulate debate.

Noting that debates on academic freedom are often treated as the sole terrain of the social sciences or the humanities to the exclusion of other academic disciplines, the AFC has resolved to take a deliberate approach to involve the whole university community in selecting the TB Davie speaker. The proposed new approach involves inviting faculties to nominate speakers, on a rotational (annual) basis. For 2022, the AFC has proposed that the Faculty of Health Sciences be asked to nominate speakers.

Nominations should please:

- not exceed three pages;
- include a brief curriculum vitae of the nominated speaker; and
- include a motivation for the nomination.
